give thanks in all circumstances;
for this is the will of God
in Christ Jesus for you.”*

The worship leader will welcome you to our Daily Prayer Service. They will introduce the topic of prayer for the day and invite you to find time in your day to offer a prayer of your own.

Then they will say:

O Lord open my lips,
and my mouth shall proclaim your praise.

Almighty God,
you fed your people in the wilderness,
and guided them by cloud and fire,
giving commandments to order their lives.
Give us eyes to see your purpose,
perseverance to follow where you lead,
and courage to know the truth that sets us free;
that our lives may be blessed,
and your will may be done.
Blessed be God for ever.

Jesus, Saviour of the world come to us in your mercy:
we look to you to save and help us.

By your life laid down on the Cross you set your
people free:

we look to you to save and help us.

When they were ready to perish you saved your
disciples:

we look to you to come to our help.

In the greatness of your mercy loose us from our
chains:

forgive the sins of all your people.

Make yourself known as our Saviour and mighty
deliverer:

save and help us that we may praise you.

And when you come in your glory make us to be one
with you:

and to share the life of your kingdom.

**Glory to the Father,
and to the Son,
and to the Holy Spirit;
as it was in the beginning,
is now, and shall be for ever.
Amen.**

And forgive us our trespasses,
as we forgive those who trespass against us.

For thine is the kingdom,
the power and the glory,
for ever and ever. Amen.**

that by reason of the frailty of our nature
